... by tomorrow you **will have been** here for seven nights.

The Smiths will leave at six-thirty tomorrow morning to go to Chicago.

By seven o'clock, they **will have left**.

The restaurant won't open until six o'clock.

We can't eat at five o'clock. The restaurant **won't have opened** yet.

will + have + 3rd form

Will you **have finished** the report by the time you leave?

By the time they get home, the Smiths **will have been** away for a week.

Can you call back later this afternoon? I **ll have made** a decision by then.
