The Smiths will leave at six-thirty tomorrow morning to go to Chicago. By seven o clock, they **will have left**.

The restaurant won't open until six o'clock.

We can't eat at five o'clock. The restaurant **won't have opened** yet.

will + have + 3<sup>rd</sup> form
